Authorization cards are good for four years from the date issued. The last time there was a mass issuing of authorization cards was in the year 2000. Therefore, the majority of fighters, fencers and equestrians are going to have their authorization cards expire this year.

NOTE: ANY TIME YOU SEND IN A REQUEST FOR A REPLACEMENT CARD, YOU MUST SEND IT WITH AN SELF ADDRESSED STAMPED ENVELOPE. IF YOU DO NOT, YOU WILL NOT GET YOUR CARD BACK.

With every new Authorization Card issued, a waiver must be on file. Therefore, when you send in for your new card you must include a filled out and signed waiver.

Well, If you read the Seneschal's Word, you already know that due to lack of a quorum the meeting was cancelled- so the minutes from September's Baronial Meeting are:

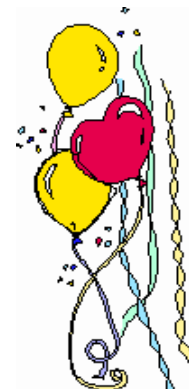

Silver Spoons: by Aiden Alpin

Greetings good gentles all! The Silver spoons have been busy cooking and planning. This last meeting Papa San taught everyone how to fix probably the most eaten dish in Japan, except noodles, at least in restaurants. That dish is "Katsudon over rice" Katsu means Cutlet and Don is Pork. This is served over a bowl of rice with a sauce poured over it. The recipe calls for flour with salt and pepper in it, two beaten eggs and Panko (White bread crumbs). The boneless pork is beaten with a mallet or plate to flatten it out then cut into strips and run through the flour with salt and pepper mix. then dip it into the egg, and finally cover with Panko. The strips are then deep fried in a generous amount of oil a few at a time until golden brown. Meanwhile fix 2 1/2 cups of water with two Tbs of Miso (dried fish stock for soup) until it comes to a boil. remove from heat and set aside. start cooking two small onions in a frypan with about four Tbs of oil. Cook until onions are translucent then add, miso, 7 Tbsps mirin, 3 Tbsps light soy sauce, 3 Tbsps dark soy sauce, and 4 green onions (cut into 1 1/2" lengths and then cut lengthwise) , and bring to a simmer. Finally take six beaten eggs and add to sauce but do

not allow eggs to set, continually stir. You want the juices and egg to seep down into the rice. Finally add approximately 1 1/2 to 2 cups of rice in a bowl topped with the fried pork cutlets and top with the sauce. Should make about six servings. It's a very good one dish meal. This month from the book of "Food" by Waverly Root I will discuss FILBERT nut. "The filbert came to Western Europe for the Hellespont", wrote Paul Lacroix in France in the Middle Ages, and indeed Pliny called it the Pontic nut. The original home of the nut is difficult to localize, for Corylus existed before HOMO throughout its present range, which includes all the land masses of the north temperate zone. (Filberts grow in South Africa today, but they were transplanted from the North. The first traces of the filbert were found in Central Asia, dating from the Eocene epoch. Filberts were probably being eaten by man in Paleolithic times, and certainly by the Mesolithic, the same period of some Swiss lake dwellings where they have been found. They appeared in large quantities in the Neolithic site at Alvasta in Sweden. The filbert was the second most widely eaten nut during the stone age, the first being the acorn. This does not necessarily mean that prehistoric man preferred acorns. Probably there were more of them. Jacob put peeled hazel and chestnut twigs into his watering troughs to encourage his cattle to conceive, an attention he neglected to give the animals of Laban, also under his care. The Greeks and Romans cultivated the trees, but the people of the Middle Ages, at least those further north, didn't bother: collecting wild nuts in the woods had been good enough for their pre-Roman Gallic ancestors and it was good enough for them, although they made considerable use of filberts for desserts and even as the basis for a drink. On the other side of the Atlantic, meanwhile, pre-Columbian Indians were making crisp cakes of cornmeal

flavored with pounded filbert. The filbert is an amiable aliment, unpretentious and unassertive, perhaps the sweetest of all nuts (raw, it outdoes even the chestnut). It manages nonetheless to offer a flavor so individual that it cannot be described by reference to any other. On the Contrary, its own very special taste is often evoked to suggest subtle overtones in other edibles - unsalted Charente butter; the aftertaste of certain wines; the elusive aroma of some mushrooms; and even an element sometimes discernable in the complex flavor of Brie. Agreeable when eaten alone, it enhances its own bland flavor and that of its host in chocolate bars and nougat, and supplies a delicate sweetness to cakes, cookies, and ice cream In American they are likely as not called hazelnuts while Englishman are likely to refer to them as cobnuts or cobs. The tree sometimes produces long nuts and then short nuts and sometimes both on the same tree in the same year. After much debate about filbert and hazelnut, in 1942 the American Joint Committee on Horticultural Nomenclature decided to call all members of the genus Corylus filberts, and to hell with it. Now you know everything about filberts that there is to learn from this book and it is time to close. Until next time, add some filberts to your cookies and see how much sweeter they taste. Crushed filbert on tapioca and custard is great too.

A Rose by any other name?

Where does the name our Scribes Guild is known by come from?

I started thinking about this not too long after finally learning how to spell it- roughly a year or so after I even started my feeble attempts at Illumination and Calligraphy- and decided that I would try to find out more about this so called demon.

Titivillus (also spelled "Tutivillus") is sometimes referred to as the "patron demon of scribes" (or of calligraphy). He is said to have been active in the Middle Ages, entering the scriptoria of monasteries and introducing errors into the scribes' work whenever their attention wandered.

Finding information regarding Titivillus was not difficult with the modern tools available to us in today's world, rather the opposite became the issue. There is a lot of information regarding this so called Patron Demon, not all of it relating to how he became such. For the purposes of this article I am only going to focus on the information regarding his role as the Patron of Scribes. More information is available for those that wish to continue in works such as Margaret Jennings' article "Tutivillus: The Literary Career of the Recording Demon" in *Studies in Philology* 74, no. 5 (December 1977), and Marc Drogin, *Medieval Calligraphy: Its History and Technique*.

Some mention has to be made however of his other roles to make the connection to the role he has been assigned as the Patron Demon of Scribes. The character of Titivillus has the distinct advantage of being created before the age of copywrite and trademarks and as such has reappeared often with different embellishments along the way. This might account for the many roles he has been assigned. Titivillus has been regarded as the cause of acedia (spiritual sloth) where he caused members of the clergy to speed up

the recitation of prayers, even causing them to skip entire syllables and also among the laity he could cause participants to gossip or just engage in idle talk, all of which would have been a severe breach of moral character in the Middle Ages. Two narratives have been used to explain this demon, the recording demon and the sack carrying demon. The recording demon was said to frequent churches and monasteries and write down the sins of anyone he saw. These were then collected and used against the guilty person in hell on judgement day. The sack carrying demon, rather than recording the information for later use, would actually gather up the lost syllables, gossip, and other slothful verbiage for the same purposes stated above.

By the fifteenth century, however, Titivillus had become more generally an evil demon causing havoc among people everywhere. Some modern writers claim that it was at this point that he became the patron demon of scribes and was blamed for the mistakes they made in copying out manuscripts.

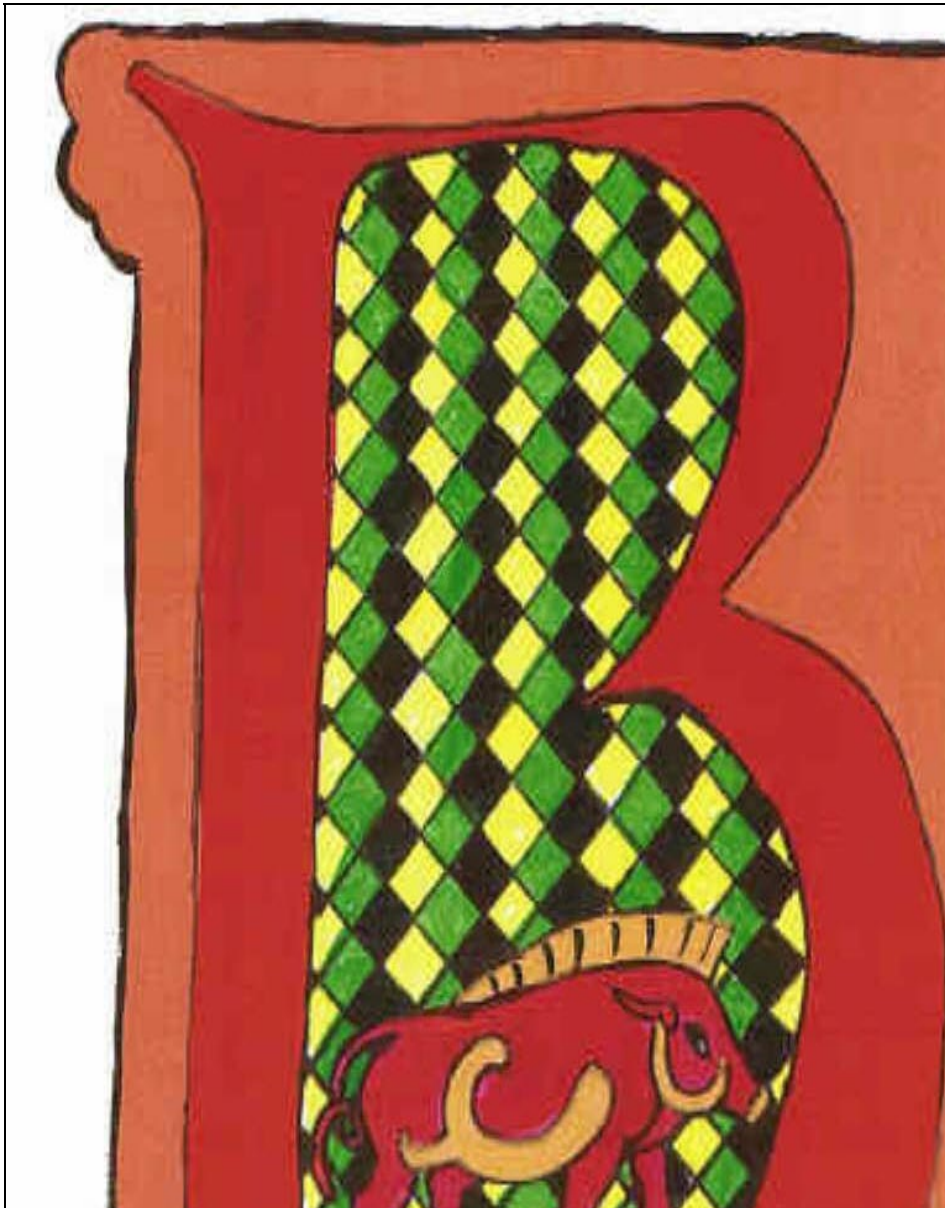
