Follow 212 to Township Road 236 and turn right (south). Follow 236 until you get to State Route 568 (Sandusky Street) and turn left (east). Follow to Township Road 241 (note road numbers may not be consecutive). Turn right (south) on TR 241 (you will cross a bridge) to TR 208. RECIPES WORTH NOTING:

Pie in a Pigskin

16th century Italian Stew
(meat pie without crust)
(Could not find source to quote)

Ingredients:

3lbs stewing beef
2 Med Onions chopped
cooking oil
1/2 c. raisins
1/4 tsp. cinnamon
1/4 tsp. Cloves
1/4 tsp. nutmeg
1/4 tsp. mace
1/4 tsp. pepper
1/2 water
1 T vinegar
Salt

Brown meat in a skillet. Then pour meat & juice into a pot. In the skillet, saute onions until transparent. Put onions into pot with meat. Add raisins, water, & spices. Simmer 1 1/2 to 2 hours, stirring occasionally. Add vinegar and salt to taste when meat is almost done.



Drepe

Almond Milk Chicken
14th Century England
From *A New Booke of Gode Cookery*

Ingredients for almond milk to make 4 cups.

1c almonds (whole or shaved)
1/2 c water (for grinding)
2c water, broth, wine or combination.(1 c water, 1 c chicken broth)
4T sugar
pinch salt
If using raw almonds- boil in water for 3 minutes, drain, rinse & squeeze off skins.
Grind almonds in water in a food processor. In saucepan over low heat, dissolve sugar and salt in water/broth/wine or combination. In a bowl, combine sugar, water & ground almonds, whisk until smooth. Cover and let sit 1 hour. Stir before using.

Drepe Ingredients

3 lbs chicken, whole (8 breasts cut in half)
4 C water
4C skimmed milk
2 Med onions chopped
1 tsp. hot mustard powder
salt
butter for sauteeing

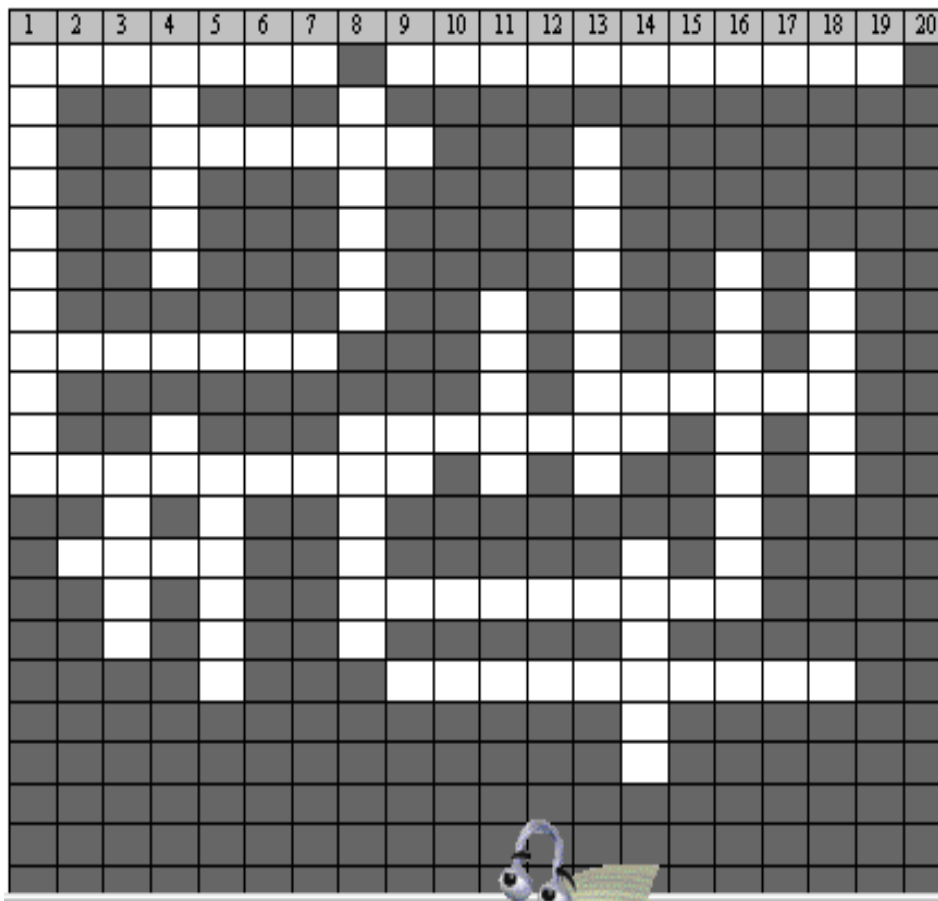
In a skillet brown chicken in butter (not margarine for taste). Put chicken in a pot with water and boil 20 minutes. Drain water. While chicken is boiling, saute onions in skillet until transparent. Combine onions with drained chicken, and add almond milk, salt, and mustard . Boil, then simmer for 10 minutes, stirring frequently. Can remove chicken from sauce & combine upon serving or leave and serve as is.

Original Recipe:

Take blanched almaundes; grynde hem and temper hem with gode broth. Take oynouns, a grete quantite; perboyle hem and frye hem and do therto. Take smale bryddes; perboile hem and do therto, and do therto pellydor and salt, and a lytel grece.
