








	Territorial Principalities.		A silver coronet with a single ‘dance’ (a raised point).

Addressed as “Your Grace” or “My Lord Duke/ My Lady Duchess”	Dukes		Ruled a kingdom more than once, a gold coronet decorated with strawberry leaves
Addressed as “Your Excellency” or “My Lord Count/ My Lady Countess”	Counts		Ruled a kingdom once, A gold embattled coronet.
Addressed as “Your Excellency” Or “My Lord Viscount/ My Lady Viscountess”	Viscounts		Former rulers of a principality, A silver embattled coronet.

Addressed as “Sir/Dame <Name>”, “Master/Mistress <Name>”	Knight (Chivalry), Master of Arms (Chivalry), Laurel, Pelican		Optional: Laurel Wreath Optional: Cap of Maintenance

Addressed as “Your Excellency” or “My Lord Baron/ Lady Baroness”	Territorial Barons and Baronesses.		A gold coronet with six ‘pearls.’
	Court Barons and Baronesses, regardless of Kingdom.		A silver coronet with six ‘pearls’

Addressed as “The Honourable Lord/Lady <Name>”	Dragon's Heart.		
	Greenwood Company, Bronze Ring, White Lance, Gold Mace, Evergreen.		A simple metal circlet, decorated as desired. The circlet may have a single raised peak, and must be no more than one inch wide at the highest point.
