expressly required that the person teach their knowledge to others as well. Bearers of this award are placed in precedence equal to those who bear the Greenwood Company, Bronze Ring, White Lance, and Gold Mace. They are higher in precedence than those who have received a simple Grant of Arms, and lower in precedence than those who have received the Dragon's Heart. They are properly addressed as 'the Honorable Lord or Lady,' as are all others of Grant-level status, and do not have any distinctive title for themselves, as do the Warders or Foresters. The badge that they may wear is shown above: the left half is purple, while the right half is gold.

The Laurel is the most prestigious Arts and Sciences award that can be given in the Middle Kingdom (or, indeed, anywhere in the Known World). It conveys a peerage, which is the highest honor anyone can hope to achieve, short of becoming King or Queen or receiving the honors that are given to those who have held those titles in the past. Peerage is a singular honor and responsibility, and whole articles can be (and have been) written to ponder its significance. So as to keep the scope of this article manageable, I will say merely that those who hold Peerages are those that the Royalty turn to first for counsel, for aid, and to provide an example to those of lesser station of how to behave rightly.



The Laurel, in specific, is one of the three peerages, and is awarded to those who "have attained the standard of excellence in skill and/or knowledge equal to that of his or her prospective peers in some area of the Arts or Sciences. The candidate must have applied this skill and/or knowledge for the instruction of members and service to the kingdom to an extent above and beyond that normally expected of members of the Society (*SCA Corpora VIII-A4-b*).” Those who are admitted into this order are expected to be a shining example of chivalry, to support and uphold the laws of the Society and of their Kingdom, to enrich the kingdom by sharing and teaching their skills and knowledge, and to advise the Crown, especially in the arena of prospective new members to their Order. While Laurels are not required to swear fealty to their King and Queen, many choose to. They are equals in precedence to those in the Chivalry and the Pelicanate, higher in precedence than Territorial Barons and Baronesses, but lower than Viscounts and Viscountesses.

Because of the prestigious nature of this award, it is the culmination of a lifetime of work and service to the arts and the Kingdom. It is common for those who become Laurels to, in time, take students to teach and guide in

really elaborate designs. I tend to stick to clean, simple pages with consistent formatting, look, and feel. I am much better at the technical aspects (making a site work, and do cool things) than I am at making them really pretty. I don't think my sites are ugly, by any means, but they aren't artistic masterpieces, either.

I would welcome the opportunity to serve the Barony in this capacity.

MIDDLE KINGDOM AWARDS - ARTS AND SCIENCES

There are quite a few awards in the Middle Kingdom which are given for excellence in the Arts and Sciences.

The Willow and the Silver Oak are the first Arts and Sciences awards. They are the only two of this type that are differentiated based on whether the area of proficiency in question is considered an art or a science: Willows are given “to individuals who, in the sight of the Consort, have shown proficiency, but not yet mastery, in one or more of the peaceful arts (*MK Law XVII-502*),” while Silver Oaks are given “to individuals who, in the sight of the Consort, have shown proficiency, but not yet mastery, in one or more of the Sciences or in research (*MK Law XVII- 602*).” What is considered a science vs. an art is a topic of much discussion, and is not specifically outlined in Kingdom Law. The Silver Oak and the Willow are both Award-of-Arms-level awards, so if someone who has not yet received an Award of Arms is given either of these awards, they are considered armigerous. Bearers of either of these two awards are equivalent to each other in precedence, and are higher in precedence than those who bear a Purple Fret, King’s Chalice, or Doe’s Grace, but lower in precedence than those who bear a Grant of Arms. Those who bear the Willow may wear the willow-tree badge above, upon which the tree is golden while the background is purple. Those who bear the Silver Oak may wear the oak-tree badge above, upon which the tree is silver, with golden acorns, and the background is purple. They are addressed as Lord or Lady.



There is a Grant-of-Arms-level Arts & Sciences award as well, known as the Evergreen. This award is given to “individuals who, in the sight of the Crown, have both taught and shown excellence in one or more of the Arts, Sciences or in research (*MK Law XVII-2502*).” This award does not draw a distinction between arts and sciences, but as it is a more prestigious award, the work necessary to be worth of it is considerably higher. Not only must one be excellent in an art or science (or more than one of these), but it is
