THE SCA'S DISTANT COUSINS:  
BELEGARTH, DAGORHIR, AND AMTGARD

Recently I was on the east side of town visiting my grandmother and drove past Camp Sertoma. Looking out my car window, I saw people in garb, period pavilions, and a bunch of people fighting in a form of combat that closely resembled heavy fighting, at least to this non-fighter. I quickly went though it in my head, determined I was definitely in Sternfeld territory, and there wasn't an event that weekend before turning into the main entrance of the camp to try and figure out who these people were and why they were playing a game that looked to my eyes a lot like the SCA. Was there another group I wasn't aware of? In a word, yes!

After parking, I hopped out of my car and wandered over to the first person who didn't look exceptionally busy and asked what group was meeting. I lucked out, in that I picked one of the best possible people to talk to entirely at random. He was a merchant who sells foam boffer weapons to two groups: Belegarth (who was holding this event) and Dagorhir. From talking to him, I learned that their games are a lot like ours in many ways, although there is a substantially smaller emphasis on period garb, the arts and sciences, etc. A lot of people who are involved are interested in those things, but they aren't specifically encouraged, at least not to the degree they are in the SCA.

Belegarth and Dagorhir actually come from a common ancestry - they were once one organization, before a scism more than 10 years ago. Only recently both groups have started going to each other's events a lot more often. Their rulesets for fighting are nearly identical and the culture is essentially the same between the two.

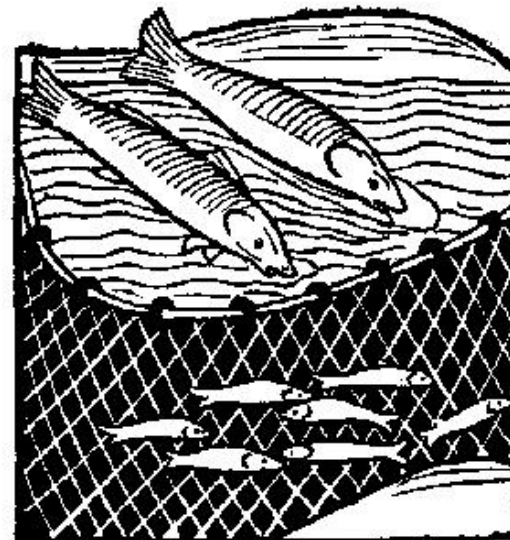
Another thing I learned from talking to this individual was that a lot of Dagorhir people and Belegarth people actually go to Pennsic. Dagorhir liked Cooper's Lake Campground so much, they actually started holding their large annual war (Ragnarok) at Cooper's Lake. It's a substantially smaller event than ours, but by far their biggest event of the year.

Many of the things that we do in the SCA, some of our cousins also do. They wear garb at events, we wear garb at events. They fight, as do we. The rules are even somewhat similar, at least to a certain point. Both us and our cousins have gradually made changes to our fighting rules to be

more safe and fair. The groups all give out awards to those who help out and stand as an example to others. We all have feasts, although the feasts at Belegarth/Dagohir events are frequently modern instead of period. This particular event was providing a catered feast prepared by a modern BBQ company. Interestingly, there are many people involved with Dagorhir and Belegarth who also participate in the SCA as well.

Talking to this individual whetted my appetite for information, so when I arrived home, I did some research on Dagorhir and Belegarth. One of the things I learned was that there is a third group, known as Amtgard. There's others as well, but these seem to be the "big three" medieval combat organizations outside of the SCA. Amtgard appears to operate very similar to the other two, but with more fantasy elements and "magic" in their game. Which makes a lot of sense, since the founder of Amtgard previously was involved with Dagorhir.

From researching online, I was able to find copies of a very interesting bit of correspondence from 1986, between the SCA Kingdom of the Outlands and Amtgard. In short, Amtgard asked if the SCA would be willing to have a diplomatic relationship with them, and/or provide a letter of formal recognition. (The answer in short: No, but we are glad you exist.) I was not able to find the original letter from Amtgard to the SCA, but I was able to find a copy of the SCA's response as well as Amtgard's response to that letter.
